

President's Report

The last year has been a great year for the club. Trading has continued to improve and the Commercial centre has attracted tenants who add to the sense of community that we have tried to foster. We have also seen many locals employed in these tenancies.

Dining Precinct

Members will also see that we are refurbishing our food areas. This is being done in two stages, with the first stage being completed in November and the second stage being completed by Easter 2017. Capacity will be doubled in these areas. This is all being done with minimal disruption to members. It is pleasing to see the interim bistro is being well patronised. As with all our renovations and extensions our members and guests will end up with a first class facility.

History Wall

Hopefully the History Wall will be completed by the time you receive this journal. It will include a refurbished Foundation Members Plaque, and two Henry Lawson poems will be recreated and placed outside the Sports Bar. Older members will remember the four poems that were situated in the foyer of the 1973 Club. We will also reinstate a tribute to local entertainers who made us proud; this was originally known as the walk of fame.

Bowling Clubs

The Board has resolved not to renew the lease at the Sports and Recreation Centre at Panania when it expires in 2017. The Club does not own the land and we lease it from Bankstown Council. Revesby Workers' Club has been involved in the site since 1986 when we took over the lease because Panania Bowling Club was experiencing financial difficulties. The current cost of continuing at the centre cannot be justified and there was absolutely no prospect of improvement in the future.

Revesby Workers' Club took over ownership of the Revesby Bowling Club in 2008 and we will now consolidate all our bowling activities at the one site in Revesby. This was flagged to happen in 2008. We have given almost two years notice of our decision to the bowlers. This allows for a reasonable transition. The consolidation will not take place until extensive refurbishments are concluded at the Revesby site.

A bowls advisory committee consisting of 50 / 50 of bowlers and directors has been established and will help with the transition to one club. While progress has been slow, much of the slowness has been out of the Boards control. As members would be aware, there has been an extensive consultation process on re-zoning that the Council has conducted in the local area. Nothing could be finalised until that process was completed.

The Revesby Workers' community takes pride in recognising the diversity of the many members that achieve great success in areas of sport, career or personal goals. The Revesby Workers' community, APL and 888PL extends a big congratulations to three Revesby Workers' members who did exceptionally well at the Main Event IV held in April at The Star, Sydney.

The Australian Poker League (APL) competitors who often play at Revesby Workers' went head to head with hundreds of other poker players at the event, which resulted in great success. The highest finishing female player, Mele Poulivaati was placed thirteen and won \$3,800 followed by Seba Challita who came in at tenth place collecting \$7,500 in prize money. What a great match; Revesby Workers' Club and the community.


This year Revesby Workers' Club are to provide the sum of \$420,000 to organisations from our local area under the ClubGRANTS scheme, Category 1 section. This program allows for direct involvement with community organisations leaving Category 2 of the scheme for the support of sporting teams, sub clubs and other special purposes to assist members and their families.


Our ClubGRANTS subcommittee have, with other member Clubs of the Bankstown group, investigated some one hundred and fifty applications from these community organisations that had submitted requests to Bankstown Council covering all types of projects from installing safety lights for the elderly in a car park to assisting in the aged care system and also providing specialised equipment for disadvantaged, special needs school children.

The diversity of the grants provided by Revesby Workers' Club is immense with our decisions to support areas generally in the south and south west of Bankstown. The Club supports groups such as Life Education (Harold the giraffe), Bankstown City Aged Care building fund, Broderick Gillawarna School with a grant to enable disadvantaged students access to basic kitchen appliances and become better able to be self-sufficient in the home, to a sewing group who provide items to those in need.

The Revesby Workers' Bill Bullard Charity Committee will be presenting Bankstown Hospital with the results of the year's fundraising on Friday 9 September 2016 in the Club function rooms. Along with sub club executive members and dignitaries we envisage a sum of around seventy thousand dollars in equipment will be presented to the General Manager and staff from the hospital.





On behalf of the Charity Committee I would like to convey my thanks to all who have contributed to making this very substantial amount available to procure the specialised equipment for Bankstown Hospital. It is our community hospital and your support is extremely important to advance the provision of good service provided by the staff.

ClubGRANTS

Revesby Workers' Club have provided many local organisations with funding through the ClubGrants program to assist with creating better opportunities for the community.

In 2015, Revesby Workers' Club donated \$7000 to Life Education NSW which went toward providing better support and educational resources for schools. The funding allowed Life Education to provide additional learning resources such as workbooks, posters and more recently new digital technology.

This year, Revesby Workers' have contributed another \$10,000 which will go toward improving the Mobile Learning Centre's with an upgrade in technology by installing ESmart Touch Screens. Life Education will also focus of further developing educational programs for secondary schools to educate teenagers on the consequences of drug and alcohol abuse.

Life Education NSW is the largest independent health and drug education provider for school children from preschool, primary and secondary school visiting 640,000 children each year. Life Education's Mobile Learning Centre travels to schools in the Bankstown area with iconic mascot, Healthy Harold, teaching children to make informed life choices, around such issues as bullying, cyber safety, drugs and healthy living.

Fundraising Manager, Lillian Adnan says that the funding will help many children become more engaged within the learning centres. "Life Education is so thankful to Revesby Workers' Club for taking the lead in assisting us in educating local children in the Bankstown region. We want to see every child in Bankstown armed with the tools to make healthy choices in their lives."

The Great Walk for Certains Our Community Break Cancer Community Community

Over many years Revesby Workers' Club have given generously to various charitable organisations that are committed to making a positive change to the lives of others.

Recently, overwhelming support from the community has seen Revesby Workers' Executive Manager, Facilities, Simon Melham and his sister-in-law Diana Melham, raise \$71,108.00 for the National Breast Cancer Foundation, whose goal it is to have 'Zero Deaths from Breast Cancer by 2030! "When Diana told me this year she would be raising money for the National Breast Cancer Foundation and that it involved trekking the Great Wall of China - I was sold!. Our fundraising campaign kick-started when we received a very generous donation of \$5,000 from Revesby Workers' Club. The support from the Board of Directors, Management and staff throughout the entire campaign has been truly overwhelming".

Fundraising Events

Team Di & Si held two major fundraising events. Firstly, a Chinese themed variety night held at Revesby Workers' Club with over 200 people attending and raising an outstanding \$15,113. In April, they held a Try Shooting event hosted by Sporting Shooters Association of Australia (SSAA) at the St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre. The event involved more than 140 people and over 50 volunteers and overall the Try Shooting event raised a staggering \$14,340.

The Great Walk

On May 19, Team Di & Si headed to China for the adventure of a lifetime that would see them walk The Great Wall over five consecutive days. The trek along the Wall provided many challenges including navigating rough and uneven surfaces, countless steps, inclines, declines, wild weather, undulating terrain and physical exhaustion. Equally, there were many highlights including the excitement of standing on top of one of the Seven Wonders of the World, breathtaking views, many cultural experiences and everlasting friendships.

"We shared this amazing journey with several women who had overcome the fight against breast cancer. These women were inspiring, heroic and truly put into perspective the real reason why we all decided to take on the challenge".

Overall, the trek covered 54 kilometres; 20.25 hours; 84,926 steps and 835 flights of stairs.

The Final Step Forward

The main interest at first seemed to be practicing with the hammers and nails, using thick chunks of bark as planks of wood. Then after gaining some confidence, the children included different pieces from the collection of loose parts with paper plates, bottle caps, coffee pods, gum nuts and corks among the most used pieces in addition to the bark. The children are gaining confidence each day in this area as they further develop their ability to use the tools effectively as they build and create with a variety of resources. The children have also been fantastic in regards to safety and always take care to handle each item carefully and watch their fingers when hammering in those nails. With so many interesting creations already being made so far, we're excited to see what the children come up with next.

Value of Nature and Outdoor Play

Today's children and families often have limited opportunities to connect with the natural environment. Richard Louv called this phenomenon, 'nature-deficit disorder' in his book, The Last Child in the Woods.

In the past decade, the benefits of connecting to nature have been well documented in numerous scientific research studies and publications. Collectively, this research shows that children's social, psychological, academic and physical health is positively impacted when they have daily contact with nature.

As children observe, reflect, record and share nature's patterns and rhythms, they are also participating in a process that promotes scientific and ecological awareness and an understanding of nature that will help our children – the next generation of leaders and decision-makers – respond to looming environmental challenges such as the impacts of climate change.

The Tree House Early Childhood centre values the importance of outdoor and nature play and ensures it is deeply embedded into our program all year. The children are encouraged to play outdoors all year, provided they bring the correct clothing. The outdoor environment at the centre paves the way for exploratory understanding of themselves, the world around them and their place in it. It allows the children to familiarise themselves with their sense of being, affords opportunities to secure respectful and reciprocal relationships. The environment also allows children to acknowledge their interdependence with others building strong positive relationships, which nurture each child's sense of being, belonging and becoming. These are a few examples of our outdoor and nature experiences to date.
